Structure of Autumn Song, "Autumn Song" by W.H. Auden is a five stanza poem that is separated into sets of four lines, known as quatrains. Each of these quatrains follows a simple rhyme scheme of AABB CCDD, and so on, changing end sounds as the poet saw fit. Auden also makes use of half, or slant, rhymes.
